

# Floppy's Phonics

At Tickhill Estfeld, your child is learning to read with *Floppy's Phonics*, a step-by-step synthetic phonics reading scheme. It introduces the children to the letters and sounds – the alphabetic code – that will become the foundation of their reading and writing. We are thrilled to be able to introduce you to the Extra Practice Zone, an area where you can continue to support your child's reading journey at home. This booklet shows you how you can help your child practise and consolidate their reading skills by using the Extra Practice Zone.



## What is the Extra Practice Zone?

The Extra Practice Zone is an area on *Floppy's Phonics Online* where your child can practise their phonics skills at home, with the help of an adult. It contains 42 interactive eBooks, each offering a range of activities that will help improve your child's reading skills. The books which you can access on Floppy's Phonics Online are the ones used in school to help your child learn new sounds, **please only look at the book that your teacher assigns so as not to confuse children, the books are carefully designed to match your child's progress so far.**

## How does my child access the Extra Practice Zone?

Your child's teacher will tell you which eBook your child should access at home.

- 2 Click on the 'Log in' link (top right).
- 3 Type in the class name and password that your child's teacher has given your child, and click 'Log in'.

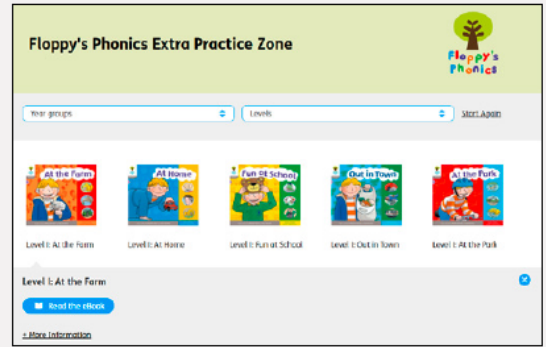
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4 Click on the 'Extra Practice Zone' button.



5 Use the 'Year groups' dropdown menu to find your child's year group, and the 'Levels' menu, then find the eBook that your child's teacher has recommended.

6 Click on the eBook to open it.



7 Explore the eBook with your child, saying the sounds and listening to the audio, and completing the pop-up activities. See below for more information on individual activities.

1		<p><b>Letter formation</b></p> <p>Click on the letters to show a video of how to write the letters.</p> <p>Try drawing the letters with your finger in the air or with a pencil on paper.</p>	
2		<p><b>Focus sound and word</b></p> <p>Click on the focus sound and related object to hear audio of the sound and the word.</p> <p>Repeat the sound and say the word.</p>	Audio only.
3		<p><b>Blending</b></p> <p>Click on the list of words to show a blending activity.</p> <p>Try to say the individual sounds on the top row and then blend the sounds together to say the word underneath.</p> <p>Use the green sound buttons and the 'Show picture' button to help you.</p> <p>Click Next to try the next word in the list.</p>

4		<p><b>Letter and sound matching</b></p> <p>Click on the Floppy button to show a letter and sound matching activity.</p> <p>Play the audio and point to the right letter as you hear the sound.</p>	
5		<p><b>Practise the sounds you've learned</b></p> <p>Click on the letters to hear the sounds you have learned so far.</p> <p>Try saying the sound before you click.</p>	Audio only.
6		<p><b>Spelling</b></p> <p>Click on the Chip button to show a spelling activity.</p> <p>Click on the top green sound button to hear the word.</p> <p>Drag the letters to make the word, using the sound buttons to help you decide which letters are in the word. When you have finished, you can click Done to check if the spelling is correct.</p> <p>Click Next to move on to the next word.</p>	
7		<p><b>Words that include the focus sound</b></p> <p>Look at the main picture.</p> <p>Click on the sound buttons to hear words of things in the picture that use the focus sound, either at the beginning, middle or end of the word.</p> <p>Say each word and listen to the focus sound in it.</p>	Audio only.
