

Reading in Class 1

Thank you for your patience this week whilst we have assigned a new reading book to your child. We wanted to make sure we had heard all the children read before giving them a new book as a lot can change over the Summer.



Reading is such a vital skill to your child and can open the door for lifelong learning.

Please try to hear your child read their reading book to you as often as you can. We ask for a minimum of 3 times a week if possible. Once you have heard your child read please write a few words in their reading record so we know your child has read at home. We will change reading books on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. We also aim to hear your child read in school each week and this will be done through Guided Reading Groups or individually.

Reading Comprehension

In Year 1 we use the Pawsome Gang to help our children develop their reading comprehension skills. There are example questions in the front of your child's reading record that link to the character of the Pawsome Gang and the skill they are developing. You can use these questions as a prompt when hearing your child read. The children will begin to become familiar with these characters over the next few weeks as we introduce them in class.
